1. Click to expand tab and see Faculty list

2. Click to expand tab and see the full list of courses.

3. Then click on the course, for more information (see large image on the right!)

4. Semester offered - in this case, the equivalent of the **WiSe** in Oldenburg. A **SoSe** course would be listed as taking place in **Spring** in Scotland.

5. Credit points—Stirling credit points have double the Oldenburg value, so this course is worth **10 ECTS** in Oldenburg.

6. Course level — **Level 10** is an honours-level course (3rd or 4th year course) in Stirling, so it would be possible to gain *Masters-level* credit for it if desired. Roughly speaking, **level 8** (and occasionally **level 7**) courses are the equivalent of an Oldenburg *Basismodul*, and **level 9** courses are equivalent to an *Aufbaumodul*.

7. To be eligible for this course you must have successfully completed at least one literary/cultural studies *Aufbaumodul* already and have it listed on your transcript of records (*Notenübersicht*).

NOTE 1: The vast majority of appropriate modules can be found the Department of **Literature and Languages**, but there may also be some appropriate modules for Cultural Studies under **History and Politics**.

NOTE 2—for Masters students: Stirling does not accept Visiting Students in English studies at Masters level. The solution is to apply and enroll as a Visiting Undergraduate Student, and to take courses at **level 10 and higher**. You can get credit for these courses in Oldenburg regardless of what your enrollment status in Scotland was.
